Why Are Children Questioning Their Identity?

Our children and youth are being fed many lies from schools, media outlets, movies, television shows, etc. As taught in CCTI's curriculum, ages twelve to eighteen are known as the Childhood Development Stage of Identity[1] as kids seek out who they are and are meant to be.

What are their real likes and dislikes, what are they good at, and how do others socially accept them?

These questions become the forefront of their minds as they navigate their daily lives. Much of the world and those who work with children know this, and they are all vying for their attention to tell them who they think they should be instead of God telling them who they were meant to be.



My own childhood memories as it relates here.

As a child, I grew up the oldest of two daughters to my police officer father, who immensely enjoyed taking my sister and me horseback riding. Also, I enjoyed learning proficiency with firearms, construction, being outdoors, camping, etc. from my father. I was a "tomboy" and not a big fan of dolls. But I still enjoyed these things as I grew older. I also began to enjoy putting on make-up, going to dances, wearing dresses, and hanging out with the girls.

I cannot imagine how I might have responded in elementary or middle school to a counselor or teacher suggesting, "You seem to enjoy many things that most boys enjoy. Would you like to consider becoming a boy?" I do not view my childhood as one of uncertainty in my gender. Instead, I look at these experiences and opportunities I had as a way God was preparing me to become a mother of two boys so I can better relate to them! I do not believe that God wastes anything in our lives, including what experiences we have throughout our childhood.

Back to how this all relates to children now.

Because of how society is approaching children, children are having difficulty knowing whom to trust and questioning everything. However, there is freedom in structure (1 Thessalonians 4:9-12), which is what God intended. God has a purpose and design for every one of us. He gave us families, with a mother and father, to grow up with. This was so that we could be taught His word and the boundaries needed to navigate this life well and in preparation for our eternal life. Unfortunately, as we all know, this truth is being questioned, denied, and torn apart, as it has been from the beginning when sin first entered the world.

How can we help children?

We must teach children that everything is not based on feelings or experiences, which are continuously changing and can be affected by many factors. There is only one immovable truth: God's law as delivered in His Word. We must be careful to teach children about the One True God, not the new gods and religions created daily, such as Therapeutic Moralistic Deism. As the father of lies often does, the Truth is distorted to make it sound like God, but it is not. We must

teach our children to discern truth through the study of apologetics, understand what reality is hidden in cultural lies, and teach our children how to combat these lies with God's truth accurately. When most morals and worldviews of children are set by the age of nine, and the majority of salvation experiences occur by the age of 18, we do not have time to lose![2]

So, What Is the Key for Children Questioning Their Identity?

We see the trauma that is being created in the varying lives that are struggling with identity. One fellow teammate, who works with international students at a US Christian college, noted the following observation: "Trauma tries to steal your identity, but it (our identity) needs to be rooted back in Christ and His purpose and plan for your life. That is the key."

Where We Stand Right Now In This Moment with Our Christian Identity in the Anonymous Age

Last week, A friend forwarded me a letter circulating in his community. It called for him to apologize for his race and placed on him the burden of hundreds of years of institutional racism and past injustices.

There was no room for dissent, no room for disagreement. Agree in every way or stand condemned. That's not uncommon in this cultural moment.

There's an incredible intensity. And, as my friend put it, incredible absolutism for each and every issue, not just the race issue. It seems that the entire world is at stake with what we think and what we say. Despite near-constant calls to have dialogue and conversations, too often tempers flare. And the whole thing devolves into a diatribe, with echo chambers reinforcing what each side has already thought. And for Christians, these moments threaten to steal our understanding of where we fit in a greater story.

How Does God Fit Into This Story?

God is writing a great story for the whole world, and Scripture reveals that story. It's the story of creation to new creation, from the heavens and earth to the new heavens and new earth. We're somewhere in that timeline, in this tale of creation, fall, redemption, and restoration.

It is important to ground ourselves in the truth that we have been created by a good God

and have been created good as part of a marvelous story of redemption and renewal. Even though in the fall of Adam, so much of God's good creation has been twisted and frustrated and is now in need of reorientation and healing.

The story is clear, that God has worked in history, in Christ, to renew His creation and to make people new, to help them understand their role in the grand story of the renewal of all things.


How Do We Become a Part of God's Story Now?

As we see this story correctly, as we become part of this story, we learn to find our moment in the larger story. Then suddenly we can have the clarity that we all need, particularly in this confusing cultural moment.

Right now, one of the most confusing things in our moment is all the bad ideas that we hear all the time about who we are, and what it means to be human. The deepest conflicts at this moment aren't moral ones. It's not a disagreement about what's right and what's wrong, even though certainly our views on that as a culture have dramatically changed. The deeper confusion is about who we actually are.

On one hand, you have Scientism's view of what it means to be human, which has dominated academia and the cultural imagination in so many ways for a century or more now. This says that we're essentially the result of mindless, costless, purposeless processes. There's no Higher Power that had us in mind, and we're not headed toward any sort of goal or purpose in history.

On the other hand, you have this postmodern construct that says that you and I are whatever we choose to be. It says that the number one responsibility to be human is to express our "true selves". And the number two responsibility is to accept other people's "true selves." But those true selves might be completely disconnected from reality. They may also be disconnected from biology, from bodies, from families, from anything other than our own self-determination. This has become a breaking point in our culture. But of course, we're not the first generation to face something nearly as challenging.



We Aren't The First Generation...

The Apostles, Peter, and Paul experienced the decadent Roman Empire. St. Patrick faced a pre-Christian Ireland. Christians throughout history have found themselves in the rockiest of social soils. And at some level, they have been able to survive and even thrive. How? By remembering what is ultimately true, what is ultimately good, and who they ultimately are in creation.

These Christians have stayed the course through Christ. How? By remembering that the Christian worldview is big enough for the challenges they faced. That reality is still true today.




